The plantation along the road frontage is a mix of Red Ironbark - *E tricarpa*, Yellow gum - *leucoxyton* and *Melaleuca species*, established in 1998.

There are a number of natural occurring native grasses and groundcover species at this site. They include Spider grass - *Enteropogon acicularis*, Windmill grass - *Chloris truncata*, Wallaby grasses - *Austrodanthonia sp*, and Spear grasses - *Austrostipa sp*. There is also Black cottonbush - *Maireana decalvans* and Creeping Saltbush - *Atriplex semibaccata*.
